Scotty Hoods

Girls tied for 2nd in 2B

The Glasgow gals enjoyed a pair of W's over the weekend — a blowout over Poplar 66-26 and a come-from-behind victory over Wolf Point 49-47 — and are currently tied for 2nd place in the District 2B standings.

Defending state champion Malta remains undefeated at 8-0 and 4-0 in the conference while the Scotties are locked up with Plentywood at 3-1 in the 2B. But that tie will be broken this Friday night as the Scotties (5-4 overall) travel to the Sheridan County seat to take on the Wildcats (5-3 overall). It's a varsity double header as the girls take the court at 6:30 p.m. followed by the boys at 8:00. On Saturday both Scotty teams will be hosting Scobey. The girls take the court at 6:00 followed by the boys at 7:30.

Glasgow 66, Poplar 26 — In the absence of Kelsie Archambeault, the Scotties got off to a slow start, leading the Indians 9-6 after one quarter of action, but came unglued for the remainder of the game. Glasgow took a 27-14 halftime lead, and after outscoring Poplar 24-1 in the third quarter, the starters rode the pine for the remainder of the game allowing everyone some quality court time. Emilee Morehouse led all scorers with 17 points. Brianne Grewe, with two momentum-swinging buckets in the final minute of the first half, had her first double-digit game of the season with 10 points. Sarah Waarvik contributed nicely with 9 points, Hannah Waters 7, Brittne Wersal 6, Kara Wesen, Taylor Markle and Chloe Sukut 5 points each, and Shelby Fossum and Makaela Herman each had a freethrow. Also playing but not scoring were Ashley Fossum, Quinn Vaira and Allyson Herman.

Glasgow 49, Wolf Point 47 — A nail-biter to the end, the Scotties were down 26-17 at the half, but clawed their way back into the game with a 20-point 3rd quarter to close the gap to 39-37 in Wolf Point's favor. 4th quarter freethrows proved to be the game winner down the stretch as the Scotties were 7-8 from the line compared to the Wolves' continued on page 3

Scotty boys break the drought

On Friday night Glasgow played host to Poplar, and despite enjoying a 15-10 first-quarter lead, the Indians were in the midst of a 24-1 run which wasn't broken until about a minute-and-a-half left in the 2nd when Joey Bergtoll finally hit a freethrow followed by a bucket from Travis Croy.

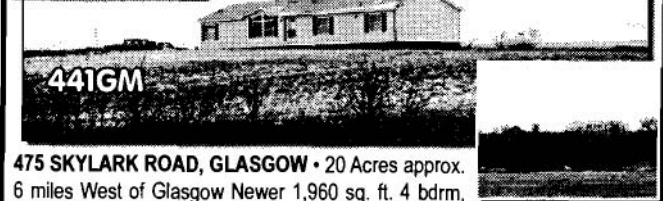
Down 29-22 to start the second half, the Scotties made up ground to be down just 42-41, but it was another tale of 4th-quarter freethrow shooting: after hitting 8-11 in the first 24 minutes, the Scotties were just 3-7 down the stretch compared to the Indians' 5-6 in the closing minutes. Poplar would hold on to win 55-52.

Jay Whitehead scorched the Scotties for 24 points. Leading Glasgow was Corey Smith with 14 (5-6 from the line), Karl Molvig 12, Danny Hagfeldt 7, Evan Etchart 6, Travis Croy 5, Drew Croy 5, and Joey Bergtoll 3.

Glasgow 55, Wolf Point 41 — Chad Dawson fired back-to-back bombs to close out the first quarter and help Glasgow to a 13-2 lead, and it was all Scotties after that as they cruised to an easy 55-41 victory, breaking a drought that goes back to December 11th when they won their first game of the season over Malta. Dawson scored 12 of his game-high 15 points in the first half and had triple treys in the game. Karl Molvig added 14, Corey Smith 10, Evan Etchart 8, Jon Page 4, Drew Croy 2 and Danny Hagfeldt 2. The Scotties shot just 6-15 from the charity stripe.

In conference standings, Harlem is on top at 3-0 (6-2 overall), followed by Plentywood 3-1, 7-1, Malta 2-2, 4-4, Glasgow 2-2, 2-7, Poplar 1-3, 5-5, and Wolf Point 0-3, 1-6.

Glasgow will be in Plentywood on Friday and host Scobey on Saturday. Tomorrow night the Scotty JV teams will host Hinsdale's boys' and girls' varsity teams (6 p.m.).

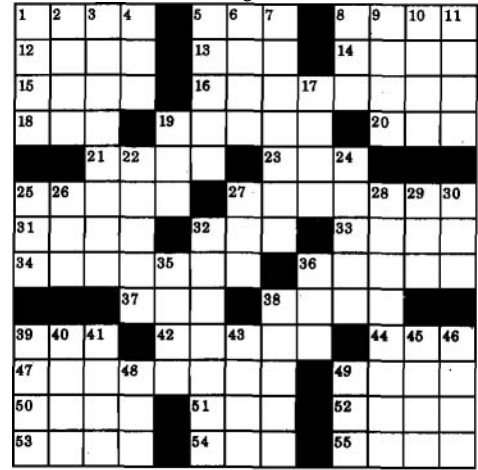

Nasty flu bug is here

Influenza has been confirmed in Valley County this past week, and in several areas around the state.

Influenza vaccine is still available for your protection. If you want to reduce your risk of those nasty symptoms, (the fever, headache, exhaustion, dry cough, sore throat, muscle aches, and occasionally stomach symptoms), stop in at the Valley County Health Department on Monday afternoons between 2:00 and 5:45 to receive your vaccination. If these hours do not work for you, please call 228-6261 to set up another time. Bring your Medicare, Medicaid, or CHIP card or the vaccine will cost \$25.

CDC is recommending the following groups be immunized: • all children 6 months to 5 years of age; • anyone 50 years and older; • pregnant; • with long term health problems and/or with weakened immune systems; • and their caretakers and household contacts.

Keep in mind that it takes about 7-10 days after vaccination for protection so the sooner you get your shot, the better your chances of warding off those nasty symptoms.
