Great news for the Children's Museum

The Children's Museum of Northeast Montana will soon have a new home in downtown Glasgow, the old JC Penny building.

This new location will provide several thousand square feet of space to create a greater variety of exhibits for the children to explore as well as greater space for a classroom. The basement area will allow for ample storage space.

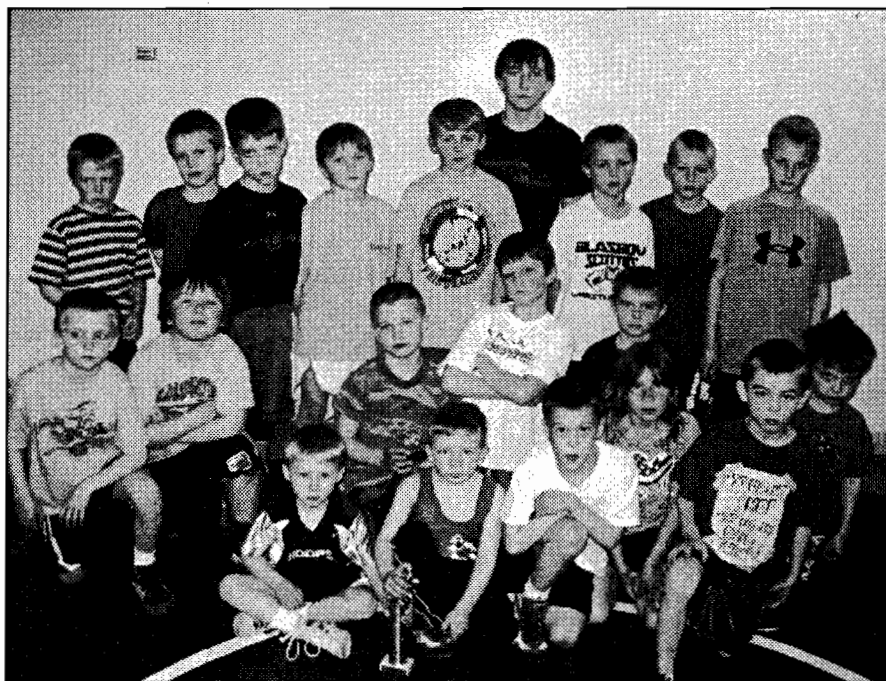
A timeline with three phases has been created for this project. Stacey Fast, Executive Director, anticipates opening the new museum in the spring of 2012.

"We have been conservative with the timeline and certainly hope that things move along as quickly as possible," she says.

Several new exhibits are in the hatch including: "The Outdoor Adventure", "Alice's Wonderland", "Science Hall 101", "Kid Town USA", "Car Care Center", "Water Works", "Welcome to Valley Farm" and "The Performance Theater" and "The Wildlife Experience".

The Children's Museum's Board of Directors are working on a local radio-thon to help with the funding needed to get the building up and

Rock Creek Tourney, Guv Cup off the Montana Walleye Circuit

Due to some ruling discrepancies, the directors of the Rock Creek Walleye Tournament and Montana Governor's Cup have pulled their tournaments out of the Walleye Trail. The tournaments will still take place at their scheduled times, they just won't count in the Montana Walleye Circuit towards *Montana Angler of the Year*.

The rule that rocked the boat had to do with trailering your fishing craft to tourney headquarters and use designated launch ramp facilities instead of, say, put in at the Fort Peck Marina and scoot across to Rock Creek, or in Guv Cup instance, put in at Duck Creek and zip around the corner to the Marina.

"Why would you want to 'trailer' your boat all the way to Hell Creek (which is on the Walleye Circuit once again) when you can put in at Fort Peck and be there in under an hour?" is how one local tournament angler looked at the new Rule #4.

However, there is an amendment to Rule 4 that if you didn't trailer there but just drove your boat long distance across the tourney waters to get to the starting line, then the boat inspectors will need to look at your GPS plot trail to verify you navigated directly there and did not scout along the way.

In the case of the Guv Cup pulling out of the Circuit, Tourney Director Anne Millard of the Glasgow Chamber explained that more than 80% of those who fish it felt that this rule change was not necessary. Also, the Guv Cup rules were already accepted by Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks last fall before any of this came up.

In the case of the Rock Creek Directors, it's a similar story: "We feel it is not fundamentally right for our tournament, therefore in good conscious and for the good of our customers, we cannot follow this amendment to the rule," says Tourney Director Steve Harada.

Tourney directors for both Rock Creek and Guv Cup stressed that it was nothing against Walleyes Unlimited or the Montana Walleye Circuit: "We go in peace and harmony and with no animosity," Harada stated, "we want to wish the Montana Walleye Circuit the very best for 2010."

Princess Pippilotta

PIPPPI LONGSTOCKING was created by a Swedish author, Astrid Lindgren, who got the name from her nine year old daughter. Pippi is nine years old and has super human strength which she uses to fool adults and friends. She is an occasional crime fighter but often tries to set a good example for others. Her fiery red hair is worn in braids that are so tightly wound that they stick out sideways from her head.

Pippi Longstocking books were first printed in 1944 to 1948 and another series of six from 1969 to 1975. Multiple films and a television series was also developed. Books were printed in over 70 languages. Most of her adventures took place on an island in the South Seas where her father — the "fat white chief" — lived after being in a ship wreck. The series continued until a final version was aired in 2002 in England.
