Military Police Company Deployment Cancelled

Malta, Mont. - Approximately 160 members of the 484th Military Police Company, a subordinate unit of the 190th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, Montana Army National Guard, received a notification this week that the mobilization that the unit was training for, in support of the Overseas Contingency

Operation, was cancelled. The unit was notified by the Headquarters Department of the Army and the Montana Adjutant General, Brigadier General John Walsh.

The unit is headquartered in Malta, with units in Glasgow and Billings. The unit received a notification for a potential

deployment earlier in 2009, thus allowing the unit time to prepare for a potential mobilization. The unit, which provides convoy and operational security to U.S. and coalition forces in theatre, has not received any other notifications for other possible overseas deployments.

Valley Cinemas land another debut

Over a year in the making — *Sherlock Holmes* filming began in October 2008 — is an upcoming test 2009 film adaptation of Arthur Conan Doyle's fictional character of the same name.

The film was directed by Guy Ritchie and produced by Joel Silver, Lionel Wigram, Susan Downey and Dan Lin. The screenplay by Michael Robert Johnson, Anthony Peckham and Simon Kinberg is based on Lionel Wigram's story and Doyle's characters.

The film is set in 1891 and revolves around Holmes (Robert Downey, Jr.) and Watson (Jude Law) stopping a conspiracy to destroy Britain. The film opens with Holmes apprehending the murderous cult leader Lord Blackwood (Mark Strong), who promises he will return from the dead and exact his revenge as he is being led to the gallows.

In May 2009, Warner Bros. released its official plot summary: *"In a dynamic new portrayal of Arthur Conan Doyle's most famous characters, Sherlock Holmes sends Holmes and his stalwart partner Watson on their latest challenge. Revealing fighting skills as lethal as his legendary intellect, Holmes will battle as never before to bring down a new nemesis and unravel a deadly plot that could destroy the country."*

The film will be released nationally on Christmas Day and will be lighting up the big screen at Valley Cinemas right here in Glasgow on Friday. *The Princess & The Frog* is being held over.

SIX enslaved Fowl-Americans producing stolen non-human animal products,

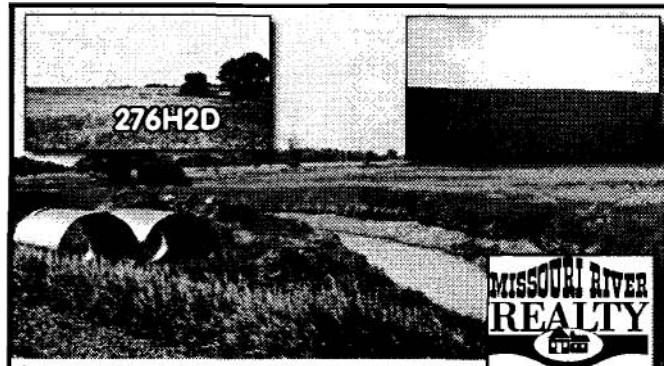

ONE Spotted Owl activist chained to an old-growth pear tree.

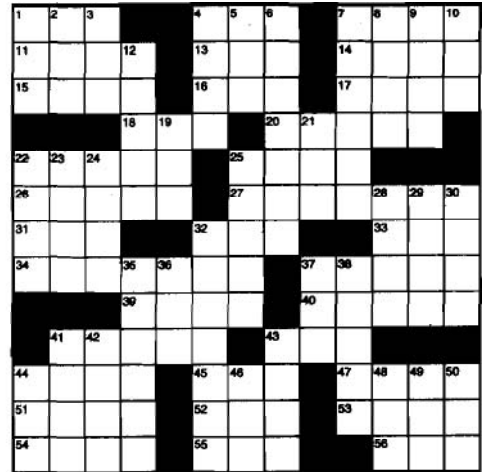

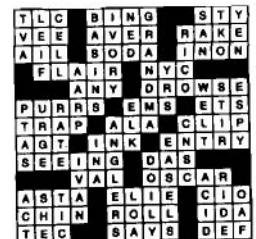
